Ash Wednesday

Blessed ashes, used on Ash Wednesday, are a profound sacramental in the Catholic Church that steer believers into the solemn season of Lent. Made from the burnt remains of the palms used in the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations, these ashes serve as a tangible reminder of our mortality and the call to repentance. As the ashes are placed on the foreheads of the faithful, the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," or "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" are said by the celebrant. This ritual marks the beginning of a 40-day journey of introspection, penance, and spiritual renewal, inviting believers to turn their hearts more fully towards God through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

The symbolism of ashes extends deep into biblical tradition, where ashes were used as a sign of penance, mourning, and humility before God. Throughout Scripture, figures like Job, Daniel, and Esther used ashes to visibly demonstrate their contrition and reliance on God's mercy. For Christians today, receiving blessed ashes is both an acknowledgment of human frailty and an expression of hope in God's boundless grace. This outward sign compels an inward conversion, urging individuals to detach from sin and reorient their lives towards the Gospel. The ashes not only remind us of our need for God's forgiveness but also inspire a sincere desire to live a life of holiness and service in preparation for the joy of Easter.

Mass will be celebrated in St. John's Church on Wednesday at 8.00am, 10.30am and 7.00pm.

Blessed Ashes will be distributed at each Mass and will be available in all three of our churches from about 11.30am and throughout the day.

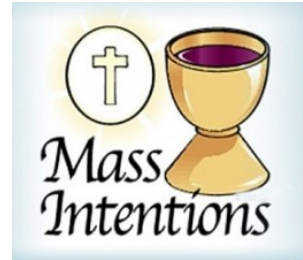

Season of Lent

Trócaire Lenten Campaign

The theme of the 2026 Trócaire Lenten campaign centres on the story of a multi-generational, female-led household in rural Rwanda. At just 28 years old, Uwamahoro is carrying the weight of three generations on her shoulders. She supports her mother, Verediana, 68, who lives with a disability, her daughter Ineza, 7 and her niece Vanessa, 12. Earning just 60 cent per day working on the land, Uwamahoro is doing the best she can to feed her family and keep the children in school, but it's never enough. The next storm could destroy everything Uwamahoro has built. Their house is crumbling, the roof is leaking, they live in darkness with no electricity, and with each storm, they fear for their safety. This is not unusual for women across Rwanda, where severe storms are striking faster and more often, before families can recover from the last. This Lent we are asking the people of St. John's Parish to help Uwamahoro rebuild her family's lives and restore their hopes for the future.
