This tradition was already present in the sixth century; by the beginning of the twentieth century it was widespread and, after consulting the views of bishops all over the world, the Pope formally and infallibly declared the doctrine of the Assumption to be part of the authentic and ancient doctrine of the universal Church.

On Friday of this week next we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin into Heaven. It is a holy day of obligation and Masses at St. John's Church will be celebrated at 6.00pm on Thursday, 8.00am and 10.30am and 7.00pm on Friday.
