IRISH RAIL ATTEMPTS TO SOFTEN BLOW

Despite reports emanating from Social Media and Local Radio stating that Irish Rail had reversed its position that the free parking concession for mass-goers ceases this weekend, we can now inform you that this is far from being the full and accurate story. What we do know with certainty is that Irish Rail has offered a temporary reprieve and a brief extension to the current arrangement.

The only communication the parish has had during the past week was from Mr Barry Kenny, Corporate Communications Manager, larnród Éireann. He states: *"It was decided at local level between our District Manager Emmett Cotter and our Station Manager Kieran Kelly that this concession/promotion would be withdrawn, and this was communicated to you... As it stands, and given the confusion, we will maintain the free parking concession with a view to reviewing it at the end of the Summer. You will understand that due to the financial constraints within which larnród Éireann operates, when the review takes place, it is likely that a decision will be taken to enforce the reduced hourly rate of \leq 1.50, which is more suited to mass goers than the 24-hour rate of \leq 4.50 which is generally in place... However, we will make no changes without advising you, and not until the Autumn. I hope this clarifies the situation for you."*

Once again, the parish reminds you that FREE PARKING is available for ALL SUN-DAY MASSES (including Saturday Vigil Mass) in JOHN'S GREE and the carpark behind GUINEYS STORE (excluding Guineys walled-in space).

LETTER TO THE SUNDAY INDEPENDENT

Dear Editor,

I wish to make a complaint about the highly offensive cartoon published prominently on the back page of the Sunday Independent edition of 27 May.

This cartoon included the caption in block lettering 'THE ROSARECTOMY' and depicted a caricature of a medical surgeon announcing '... MISSION ACCOMPLISHED ... OBSTRUCTION REMOVED ...' holding aloft a set of Rosary Beads over a female patient lying in a hospital operating theatre with the words 'MNA na hEireann 25.5.18' on her cover sheet.

As you are aware the Press Council of Ireland's Code of Practice, in Principle 8, advises that "the press shall not publish material intended or likely to cause grave offence or stir up hatred against an individual or group" identifying a number headings including the category of "religion."

Your cartoon is offensive to Catholics and makes a mockery of the Rosary prayer which honours the Blessed Virgin Mary and celebrates the mysteries of the life and death of Jesus Christ. Many Catholics have a particular devotion to the Rosary which is deeply revered as the centrepiece of the traditional prayer in the home and at family funerals.

For a mainstream media outlet, such as yours, to refer to the Rosary in such a contemptuous fashion is more serious than just being a one-off insult. It has consequences. People of faith suffer. It contributes to a groupthink attitude which has a polarising effect on our society. Your publication adds to this environment as it exemplifies an anti-faith editorial bias.

I ask that you publish an apology in your next edition.
