Changes in Times & Numbers of Masses

For quite some time now, the staffing of parishes, the grouping of parishes into **Pastoral Areas** and the numbers of masses within these Pastoral Areas, has come under much discussion.

Relating to our own parish, the *Four City Parishes* have been clustered into one *Pastoral Area*. And, as in all pastoral areas throughout the Diocese, the Bishop has mandated representative priests and members of the relevant Parish Pastoral Councils to come together to rationalise mass-times and mass-numbers in each area. The numbers attending masses, the frequent overlapping of mass-times, and the diminishing numbers of available active priests, were all to be taken into account in these decisions.

All Pastoral Areas throughout the Diocese will have made their decisions for change by the end of June, and with the approval of the Bishop, these changes will come into effect on the First Sunday of Advent this year - Dec. 1st. Changes affecting our parish will be published next weekend, the last weekend of June. A full listing of Pastoral Areas and changes will follow at a later date.

Corpus Christ

Many people have memories of the Corpus Christ procession when the monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament was brought around the parish. All groups in the parish were represented. Children scattered petals before the host and houses were decorated. The meaning of the feast was to bring the Lord into the streets of his people and to appreciate the gift he gives us of himself in the Eucharist. This procession still takes part in many places.

On Holy Thursday we also celebrate the Eucharist, but in another way It is more of the sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary. We unite ourselves with his offering that brought him to death, and look forward to the resurrection when the risen Lord would be present in many ways among people, including in the form and shape of bread and wine. On the feast of Corpus Christ ,the Body and Blood of Christ, the emphasis is more on gift than on sacrifice.

The Eucharist as Gift

This is what he wishes to leave us as a gift forever. It is the way he could give himself forever in a very close way, so that this is his gift of 'food for the journey.'

We need this gift. We need to know certainly that God is close with us in life, and the Eucharist at Mass gives us this certainty. We need to know that God is really present in our lives, and we know this in the real presence of the Eucharist.

Lord in this Eucharist today I welcome you into my life; help me to live like you and love like you. Amen.
