Forgiven, not Forgotten.

Some years ago The Corrs released a song called 'Forgiven, not forgotten.' It did well in the charts but, popular though the song was, we know that it is not easy to either forgive or forget. All too often, deliberately or accidentally, we hurt others or are hurt by others. Sometimes the hurt and the enmity run deep. Sometimes, too, we find ourselves quick to judge and condemn. Reconciliation and forgiveness can be extremely difficult.

Yet the challenge to forgive is at the heart of our faith. It is something Jesus preached about over and over again, as he does in today's Gospel; something he practiced in his own life and that he asks his followers to do, too.

And the reason is simple: it is because God has forgiven us first. No matter who we are or how sinful we think we are, God has forgiven us first. God's mercy is always greater than our wrongdoing or our sense of justice.

That is the extraordinary story of our salvation - that our God is a loving, forgiving God, who never stops loving and forgiving us. Time and again in the Old Testament we find God forgiving God's people, even when they let God down, even when they didn't deserve it. And the New Testament tells us that God's only Son was sent among us to save us, by dying on a cross, even thought we don't deserve it. All done out of love. All free gift.

And that must be our motive for forgiving. We must forgive because God has forgiven us; we must be merciful because God has been merciful to us. It is as simple and challenging as that.
