From St. Stephen's Day, 26th December we are obliged to return to celebrating Mass online. This means we cannot have a congregation at any of our usual Sunday or weekday Masses or services. Such celebrations will be broadcast on our webcam at stjohnskilkenny.com and on radio at 106.8fm and we invite you to continue our parish worship in this way. It is important that, as a parish, we continue to worship and pray together even if it is on a virtual platform.

For the moment Mass times in our parish will be as follows:

St John's Church:	Sundays/Holy Days: Vigil at 6.00pm; Sunday at 11.30am and 7.00pm.
	Monday to Saturday: 10.30am each morning.
Dunmore:	Masses suspended.
Johnswell:	Masses suspended.

We apologise for the inconvenience and distress caused which is outside our control.

Please note that outside of Mass times our churches will remain open for private prayer and visits to the cribs.

Under the new regulations funerals are restricted to 10 mourners. While this will prove difficult for all it is seen as essential for the protection of the family and the wider community.

With effect from 3rd January 2021 up to six guests are permitted to attend a wedding ceremony and reception, whether indoors or outdoors.

Baptisms, except in the danger of death, are postponed for the moment.

Pope's Message for World Day of Peace

"There can be no peace without a culture of care," Pope Francis stresses in his message for the 54th World Day of Peace, to be held on 1st January 2021. In his message the Holy Father calls for "a common, supportive and inclusive commitment to protecting and promoting the dignity and good of all, a willingness to show care and compassion, to work for reconciliation and healing, and to advance mutual respect and acceptance." In this task, Pope Francis offers the principles of the Church's social doctrine as a compass on the path to peace.

Established by Pope St. Paul VI in 1967, the first World Day of Peace was observed on 1st January 1968. On New Year's Day, the Church also celebrates the solemn feast of Mary, Mother of God.
