Scripture Reflection

'You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name." - Exodus 20:7

It is disrespectful to curse and swear at others using the name of God. But this commandment is not just about cursing and swearing; it is concerned with the ways in which we use God's name to justify things that are contrary to the ways of God.

Some people misuse God's name to justify killing others. Some people misuse God's name to manipulate and oppress others. Some people misuse God's name to enforce unjust laws and inflict punishment on others. Some people misuse God's name to keep people in bondage.

Our relationship with God must reflect the God of the Covenant who promised to be faithful to the people, to show love and compassion in times of need, and to be merciful and forgiving. As partners of God's Covenant, we, too, promise to be like God in the world: faithful, loving, compassionate, merciful and forgiving towards people. When we speak and behave negatively towards others, we not only misuse the name of God, we also misuse the power and wisdom of God.
