Late for a Funeral

As a bagpiper, I play many gigs. Recently I was asked by a funeral director to play at the graveside service for a homeless man. I finally arrived an hour late and saw the funeral guy had evidently gone and the hearse was nowhere in sight. There were only the diggers and crew left and they were eating lunch. I felt badly and apologized to the men for being late.

I went to the side of the grave and looked down, and the vault lid was already in place. I didn't know what else to do, so I started to play.

The workers put down their lunches and began to gather around. I played out my heart and soul for this man with no family and friends. I played like I've never played before for this homeless man. And as I played 'Amazing Grace'', the workers wept. They wept, I wept, we all wept together. When I finished, I packed up my bagpipes and started for my car. Though my head was hung low, my heart was full.

As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I never seen anything like that before, and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years."

Easter Sunday Reflection

"Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" - Mark 16:3

A stone is a symbol of something that blocks, obstructs, or prevents passage. A blocked artery keeps oxygen-rich bold from flowing into the heart muscle, causing discomfort, shortness of breath, heart disease and failure. Unless the artery is unblocked, the chances of heart failure are increased.

On a spiritual level, the love of God in our hearts is blocked by fear, anger, resentment towards others, jealousy, or selfishness. These are the stones in our hearts that can cause spiritual discomfort and death within us. Left unattended, we project our inner pain an discomfort onto others, inflicting hurt and pain in their lives.

As Christians, we believe that baptism makes us one with the risen Lord who lives in our hearts. Our attitude and behaviour towards others is supposed to be a reflection of what is in our hearts. Until the stones of fear, anger, resentment towards others, and selfishness are removed from our hearts, the love of the risen Lord cannot be experienced by others.

At Easter all the stones have been rolled back from the entrance of our hearts so that the love and peace of the risen Jesus can go forth into the world. For believers, the resurrection opens up new ways and opportunities for people to experience the liberating power of God's love.

Lord, your rising from the dead gives the world renewed hope. Remove the obstacles from my life that keep me from believing and trusting in the power of your resurrection.
