## **Re-opening of Churches for Public Worship**

Your priests and the members of the Parish Pastoral Council join with the members of the congregation in warmly welcoming the Government's announcement that our parish churches may reopen for public worship on Monday, 10th May. As Bishop Denis says in his statement: "It has been a long lockdown journey since St. Stephen's Day." As we reopen the three churches in St. John's Parish for public Masses our return to worship must be gentle and gradual and strictly in adherence with the Government's guidelines. Please God we will act cautiously and with restraint and keep our families and our community safe and well. We will return to our full Mass schedule with limited attendance in all our churches from Monday,  $10^{th}$  May.

The Government guidelines specifically advises that 'other religious ceremonies such as Communions and Confirmations should not take place at this time.' This is disappointing news on which we must reflect over the next few days. Parents will be informed of revised dates when we are in a position to announce them.

Baptisms are permissible under the relaxed restrictions but always adhering to the guidelines. Parents are invited to contact the Parish Office from Tuesday to book the celebration of baptism. The priests will do all in their power to facilitate families and to reduce the backlog of people awaiting baptism. It is advised that families should not have gatherings at home to celebrate the baptism of their child in church. If such gatherings led to the spread of the virus, baptisms and possibly other church events could be curtailed again for the whole community.

From Monday, 10<sup>th</sup> May up to fifty people may enter a church for funerals and weddings. People should wear face coverings, sanitise their hands on entering and leaving church and maintain a social distance of two metres. Only six people may attend wedding receptions held indoors and fifteen may attend if the function is outdoors. Those accompanying funerals to the cemetery should be small in number, keep a safe social distance and refrain from hugging and hand shaking.

While our society is opening up, the pandemic is still with us and we must remain vigilant. Let us do all we can to remain safe and well as we make our way back to our churches.

Bishop Denis Nulty, the Apostolic Administrator for Ossory, has issued a statement on the return to the sacraments which is available on www.ossory.ie. Please keep an eye on our parish website - www.stjohnskilkenny.com - for further updates concerning our parish.

### May Altars in Honour of Our Lady

# **National Church Synod**

The Bishops want to know: What would be your preferred option for engagement in a conversation process about a national synod? The Irish Catholic Bishops announced at their Winter 2020 meeting a new Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland, leading to the holding of a National Synodal Assembly within the next five years.

Before embarking on an initial two-year phase of consultation, bishops are inviting submissions, up to Pentecost (23<sup>rd</sup> May) 2021, to reflect on what methods/models would be best to adopt in these coming two years of conversations. For e.g.: focus groups, parish hall meetings, questionnaires, deep-listening sessions; written submissions; family focused gatherings; summary of findings of assemblies that have already taken place across dioceses; and/or conferences.
