# The Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation

In a letter to all parishes this week Bishop Denis Nulty, the Apostolic Administrator of Ossory wrote:

I saw, with great pride, the many young people who queued this past weekend at the walk-in vaccination centres to avail of their first dose of the much-needed vaccine. Such was the turn out that we drew the attention of other nations. We have done so much as individuals, as parishes, as communities, as counties and as a country. Better days are, we all feel, within touching distance.

In this context, and in a recognition of the great sacrifice we have all already undertaken, I am asking parishes to continue to abide by current official guidelines. I am hopeful that these will ease in the weeks ahead and I do hope that as the month progresses and we start a return to schools that the resumption of all sacramental celebrations will be possible.

With this instruction in mind the celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion will not take place in St. John's Parish until sometime next month. On the reopening of our schools, we will discuss the issue with parents/guardians and teachers and announce a date for the celebration of the sacrament.

Bishop Denis Nulty has fixed Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021 as the date for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for all Kilkenny City parishes. This celebration is due to take place at Nowlan Park at 6.30pm on that day. At this time, we have no reason to believe this celebration will not go ahead.

We promise to keep parents and candidates for both sacraments updated. In the meantime, candidates and their families are encouraged to continue to pray and make preparation for the celebration of these important sacraments.

### Uphill Struggle

Have you ever felt like giving up? Elijah certainly did. In today's first reading we meet a prophet who has had enough. He is fleeing from trouble and things seem so hopeless after a day's journey that he sits under a bush and begs God to take his life. Life has a way of getting on top of us, such as when we are grieving a loss, when we are hurt by a friend, when illness strikes, or when we are simply exhausted. We experience the feelings described in the famous anonymous poem *Don't Quit*:

When things go wrong as they sometimes will. When the road you're trudging seems all uphill...

At these times of struggle it is helpful to pause and to refuel for the journey. Elijah was visited by an angel who offered him comfort and respite, giving him the strength, he needed to carry on.

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus again say he is the living bread. Some people have been complaining about his teaching. Surely this is the son of Joseph, they say, demonstrating their lack of understanding of who Jesus really is. Again, he explains that he is the Bread of Life - more than physical food, more than an ordinary man, he is the Living Bread, and he is God.

In all our struggles, especially when we feel like giving up, Jesus offers us nourishment for the journey. This gift is there for us especially in the Eucharist, offering comfort and strength.

The Eucharist, although it is the fullness of sacramental life, is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak. (Pope Francis)

St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe, most faithful son of St. Francis, the beggar of Assisi, inflamed with love for God; you journeyed through life practicing heroic virtues and performing true apostolic deeds. Turn your gaze on us who honour you and have recourse to you.

Radiating with the light of the Immaculate Virgin, you brought countless souls to holiness and introduced them to various apostolic endeavours for the victory of good over evil and to thereby extend the Kingdom of God throughout the whole world.

Perfectly conformed and united with Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour, you achieved such a high degree of love of neighbour that you were able to freely offer your life in exchange for a fellow prisoner in witness of true evangelical charity.

Beg the Lord on our behalf that, filled with the same fire of love, our faith and good example might also bring others to Christ and secure for us the reward of everlasting life, where we shall praise Him together with you in eternal glory. Amen.
