We have now begun our Advent journey, a time of patient waiting and joyful hope. We look forward to the celebration of Christmas with quiet expectation and turn our hearts to the Lord with confidence and trust.

Only Two Weeks Left

The four weeks of Advent, well used, enable us to prepare for the Christmas Season, the celebration of the coming of Christ on earth. Christmas is a most sacred event and it challenges us to reflect on our lives of faith and on the true meaning of the event. Why do we celebrate Christmas and what is it that we celebrate?

For many Advent has become a commercial season but underneath it assures us that we are again preparing to welcome Christ into our lives and our communities. Many traditions have been lost over the years. There was a time when the Christmas Season dictated what we should do and how we should celebrate but today's society leans towards secularism and individualism that discourages social participation in every form including religious and social values.

With all the complexities of living today – overshadowed by Covid – we can easily lose track of the fundamentals of our human existence.

This Sunday is also Gaudete Sunday when we are invited to rejoice as a Christian community anticipating with hope that this Christmas will be one of meaning and prudent responsibility that we share with one another.
