#### We Welcome the Crib and Christmas Tree

Cribs and Christmas trees will be erected in our churches during the coming week. We thank those who do this task at a very busy time every year. Thanks also to our team of sacristans for their hard work not just at Christmas but throughout the year.

The first Christmas crib is attributed to St Francis of Assisi. In 1223, just three years before his death, Francis went to visit the Friars living in the remote mountain village of Greccio. St Bonaventure tells us that in order to excite the people of Greccio to celebrate the birth of the Saviour with all solemnity, Francis brought together all the elements of the stable in Bethlehem into what would become the very first Christmas crib.

Francis used real people, straw and animals to bring the Christmas story to life for the people of Greccio. People came from far and wide to see this spectacle. The night was aglow with candlelight as hymns were sung in praise of the God who is with us.
