Feast of the Epiphany

The Feast of the Epiphany is celebrated on this Thursday, 6th January. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek *epiphainen*, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." In this way, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).

Thursday is a holy day of obligation and Masses in St. John's Church will be at 6.00pm Wednesday (vigil) and 8.00am, 11.30am and 7.00pm on Thursday. These Masses will be broadcast on webcam and radio. There will be no Masses in Dunmore and Johnswell.
