
#### **First Holy Communion Day**

## Charles de Foucauld (1858-1916)

Among ten people to be canonised by Pope Francis in Rome on this Sunday will be Blessed

Charles de Foucauld. Charles, born in 1858, was a French aristocrat and religious, whose work and writings led to the founding of the Congregation of the Little Brothers of Jesus. During his adventurous life, he was a Cavalry Officer in the French Army, and then an explorer and geographer before becoming a Catholic priest and hermit who lived among the Tuareg in Algeria's Sahara Desert. He lived a life of prayer, meditation and adoration, in the incessant desire to be, for each person, a "universal brother", a living image of the love of Jesus. On 1st December 1916, he was killed by bandits.



Saint Charles de Foucauld, pray for us, help us to abandon ourselves totally to the Father, "without measure, with infinite confidence", because he is our Father and you, you are our friend. Pray for us!

Pope Francis will also canonise Blessed Titus Brandsma, a Dutch Carmelite who was killed for his heroic resistance to Nazi pressure on Catholic media outlets to betray their principles. Fr. Titus's journalism put him on a collision course with the occupying forces in Holland.
