Sharing the Good News

As local listening processes are being completed around the country Dr. Nicola Brady, Chair-

person of the Steering Committee of the Irish Synodal Pathway, spoke about questions that are frequently asked at parish level about the Synodal Process in an exclusive interview with *Intercom* magazine.

Dr Brady explained that the term 'synod' comes from the Greek for 'together on the way'. Synodality is a way of being Church. It is a spiritual practice and not just a debate about how the Church is organised. It is intended to facilitate a wide-ranging process of reflection and discernment. Dr Brady emphasised that all of the faithful are invited to take part in the Synodal Pathway. She said,

"We want to convey to people that the invitation is open to everyone to get involved".

Following discussions at local and diocesan level the listening process has now been completed for the Diocese of Ossory, the findings have been synthesised and were presented to the public at a meeting at St. Kieran's College last weekend. "The level of engagement with the local listening has been encouraging, and it is hoped that this will provide a strong foundation for the planning work for Ireland's National Synodal pathway." Dr Brady said.

The results from the Diocese of Ossory will be passed on to a National Pre-Synodal Assembly which will take place in Athlone on Saturday, 18th June, with a closing liturgy in Clonmacnoise, before the final submission to the Vatican.

Pentecost Sunday, which this year falls on Sunday, 5th June, has been designated as a Day of Prayer in Thanksgiving for the Diocesan Synod Phase of the Universal Synod. "As diocesan delegates and representatives of the National Steering Committee and other participating groups gather in Athlone to prepare the national synthesis, we would appreciate your prayers for a day of courageous listening, meaningful sharing and a renewed commitment to being a missionary church." Special prayers and petitions will be included at all Masses in St. John's Parish on next weekend. Please remember this intention in your personal and family prayers.
