Vestment Colours

Liturgical colours are specific colours used for vestments and banners within the context of Christian liturgy. The symbolism of violet, white, green, red, gold, black, rose and other colours may serve to underline moods appropriate to a season of the liturgical year or may highlight a special occasion. The Church uses colour so that our sense of sight might deepen our experience of the mysteries of salvation, just as incense recruits our sense of smell and music that of hearing.

In Church green is the colour of Ordinary Time, the orderly sequence of weeks through the year, a season in which we are being neither single-mindedly penitent (in purple) nor overwhelmingly joyful (in white).

White is the colour of heaven. In Church, it is used when we celebrate the feasts of the Lord; Christmas and Easter, the great Seasons of the Lord; and the Saints. We are, after all, celebrating!

Unfortunately, black and amber is not a recognised liturgical colour. On this weekend, when we celebrate the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the assigned vestment colour is green. However, based on strong local culture, the priests find it inappropriate to wear green vestments in church this weekend and have opted for white instead. As mentioned above "white is the colour of heaven... it is used when we celebrate!"

This weekend we intend to celebrate. Come on the Black and Amber!!

A Thought on Summer Sundays

In June, Pope Francis spoke to a group of Sicilian clergy about homilies. It wasn't the first time this Pope has spoken on the subject, and he often mentions that homilies should be brief; under



eight minutes was the Pope's advice this time. It makes sense. One priest repeated a humorous phrase among homilists, "if you haven't struck oil in seven minutes, stop boring."

But if you read what Pope Francis has advised on homilies, you see his emphasis isn't on time, despite the headlines. Brief homilies are the most effective, but most of us aren't as concerned with quantity as quality. Too often homilies, said Pope Francis, "are abstract, and instead of awakening the soul, they put it to sleep." He might have added that sometimes it's more than the soul that goes to sleep. A poor homily, the Pope said, "descends to moralism and abstract concepts; it presents the Gospel with detachment, as if it were outside time, far from reality."
