World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

This Sunday is designated as the Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Bishop Denis Nulty invites all parishes to reach out to grandparents and the elderly on this Sunday.

Bishop Denis said, "Grandparents and the elderly need to know they are valued and cherished by us - in our families, in our parishes and by the wider society. The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly offers us a new opportunity to celebrate them and to let them know how much they mean to us. We need them. They have much to offer us and we have much to learn from them.



"Pope Francis' message for this year's World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly very much makes this point.

He encourages the elderly to persevere in hope, to embrace the power they have to transform the world through prayer and a revolution of tenderness.

"The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year's celebration is from the Psalms 'In old age they still bring forth fruit' (Ps 92:14). Pope Francis says that old age is no time to give up and lower the sails, but a season of enduring fruitfulness in which a new mission awaits us."

Bishop Denis continued, "I am very encouraged by Pope Francis' words as I look around our Church and see the long and faithful service offered by our older priests and religious and the decades long commitment of so many lay faithful to our parishes. Grandparents and the elderly are at the heart of our parishes.

"My favourite line from the Pope's message is when he invites us to be poets of prayer: 'Let us too become, as it were, poets of prayer: let us develop a taste for finding our own words, let us once again take up those taught by the word of God. Our trustful prayer can do a great deal: it can accompany the cry of pain of those who suffer, and it can help change hearts. We can be "the enduring 'chorus' of a great spiritual sanctuary, where prayers of supplication and songs of praise sustain the community that toils and struggles in the field of life.'

"What a wonderfully uplifting challenge to all of us to become poets of prayer! I invite parishes across the country to celebrate grandparents and elders, not forgetting our more senior priests and religious. I would also encourage parishes to ensure that their local nursing care home is included in this important annual celebration."

The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly was celebrated for the first time in July 2021. The annual celebration takes place on the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saint Joachim and Anne, parents of Mary and Grandparents of Jesus.

Points to Ponder

Sometimes we miss what is hidden in plain sight. Today's Gospel is not just about prayer it amounts to a call to arms. It begins with the disciples asking Jesus how to pray. Immediately Jesus pivots them to a radical message by praying not to 'My' or 'Your' Father but to 'Our' Father. In this way the centrality of the community in the Christian life is powerfully high-lighted. Later on Jesus escalates the social message by asking us to make God's Kingdom come 'on earth as it is in heaven'.

This is important correction to those who believe in a 'suck up your suffering' philosophy. Of course, there are certain sufferings like illness or bereavement that we may be able to avoid. However, there is also unnecessary suffering that we could and should avoid like dehumanising poverty. Jesus understood that the Kingdom of God which he was inaugurating was coming into this world. It was not a spiritual or other-worldly kingdom. It was in this world, but not of this world – The Kingdoms of this world were kingdoms of greed, inequality, where abuse of power was the norm, kingdoms which came into existence through violence, and were maintained by violence. The Kingdom of God was a Kingdom of non-violence, equality, caring and sharing, reaching out to the unwanted, where power was given to serve, not oppress. This new Community was a Kingdom over which God, in the person of Jesus, reigns. The Kingdom of God was to be in this world, a light for all to see, a community which lives together in solidarity and equality.

Feast Day of St. Martha

Next Friday, 29th July is the annual feast day of St. Martha. Some of us are like Martha and some of us are more like Mary; but there is in all of us a built in need to combine the two within us, for without sitting and listening to God our work for God can only lead to anxiety and anger and without doing the work our faith is clearly nothing.

National Novena to Knock

This year's Novena will take place from Sunday, 14th to Monday, 22nd August, offering pilgrims nine days of reflection and prayer and a chance to connect with their faith in the unique and sacred space of Knock Shrine. This year's theme is 'A Journey in Hope'.

Commenting about the Novena, Fr Richard Gibbons, PP and Rector at the Shrine said. "The purpose of the Novena is to recognise the unique role that Knock, as an International Eucharistic and Marian Shrine, has to play in the life of the Irish Church and to honour Our Lady.
