## The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> August is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a holy day of obligation and Masses will be celebrated in St. John's Parish Church at 8.00am, 11.30am and 7.00pm. We look forward to celebrating this great occasion with you. There will be no Mass in Johnswell and Dunmore Churches.

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary gives us a bright hope for our own future; it is our Ladder to Somewhere! That somewhere is where we all long to reach some day. The solemnity reminds us that when we too live lives pleasing to God and cooperate in His plan of Redemption, we will be raised on our last day, we will be given glorified bodies and will share in God's glory where our Blessed Mother who is already present and will show us the way.

Mary's Assumption is God's promise to us too. In 1950, Pope Pius XII declared Mary's Assumption into Heaven to be an official dogma of the Catholic faith, by stating, "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the Immaculate Mother of God, the Ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory".

## Sacred Space in St. John's Church

As part of Fr. Lorcan's funeral Mass our sacristan, Jane, erected a special space in the sanctuary to help us reflect on the life and ministry of our friend. Among the items included are:

A <u>bowl of water</u>, a <u>confessional stole</u>, a <u>ciborium</u> and a <u>loaf of bread</u> and some <u>grapes</u>: These represent Lorcan's baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Confession and 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion which he celebrated in this church.

The <u>Bible</u>, <u>Crucifix</u>, <u>Paschal Candle</u> and <u>Holy Water</u>: Great symbols and reminders of our calling as Christians. These are placed in or near our sacred space to remind us of our dignity. Fr. Lorcan was ordained in St. Mary's Cathedral on 6<sup>th</sup> June 1982 and celebrated his First Mass at St. John's on the following day. The <u>chalice</u> and <u>Book of the Divine Office</u> reminds us of the Masses and prayers offered during his ministry of 40 years.

The Oil of the Sick and the Ritual of the Sick reminds us of the many years he served us as Chaplain at Aut Even, Kilcreen and St. Luke's Hospitals.

The <u>Parish Book of the Dead</u>: Fr. Lorcan was a popular and influential preacher. One of his favourite themes in homilies was our need to be grateful for those who have gone before us and who will one day greet us and warmly welcome us to Heaven.

A <u>photograph</u> and <u>flowers</u>: These serve as a reminder of Lorcan and a tribute to his goodness.

Please come and spend time in reflection and prayer for Fr. Lorcan at our sacred space.

#### **Points to Ponder**

What are you passionate about? The environment, politics, your football team... Jesus was passionate about his mission. He knew it would mean his death, but this seems to have made him show an even greater sense of urgency. He is like the prophet Micah, whom Luke quotes here, who, while seeing the divisions in families, puts his trust in God alone (Micah 7:6).

The Gospel is a call to conversion, to becoming 'a new creation' (2 Corinthians 5:17). It means shedding the skin of a former way of living. Does my Christian faith make a real difference to the kind of person I am and to the find of life I lead?
