In the Wake of the Coronavirus

While some cases continue to be identified in our area the community is beginning to regain confidence and getting back to normality following the Covid-19 pandemic. Venues are beginning to fill again for concerts and other events and other places, like schools and colleges, have relaxed their restrictions. There is no longer a reason why most people cannot return to Mass in church on a regular basis. In an effort to remain cautious in our churches and do everything we can to protect ourselves and our vulnerable neighbours and friends we suggest the following guidelines.

- Do not come to church if you are sick or have symptoms of a transmittable illness.
- Holy Water is available in the fonts at the doors.
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- We encourage the use of masks. However, mask wearing is optional.
- Keep a safe distance from others we continue to maintain 'blocked off' pews at the back of St. John's Church. Give others space to reduce close contacts if they so wish.
- Do not shake hands at the sign of peace a nod or a smile is an acceptable alternative.
- Continue to use the local guidelines for the procession to receive Holy Communion.
- Only receive Holy Communion in the hand.
- If you use a missalette or read a newsletter while in church please take it home and dispose of it in a responsible manner.
- Contribute to the first collection at the door as you enter church. Contribute to the second collection at the door as you leave church.

These actions will also help to reduce the spread of other respiratory infections, such as flu, which can spread easily and may cause serious illness in some people.
