108th Word Day for Migrants and Refugees

Pope Francis has chosen "Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees," as the theme for the 108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, which is celebrated on this Sunday.

The Day is observed every year on the last Sunday of September as an occasion to express support and concern for people who are forced to flee their homes, to encourage Catholics worldwide to remember and pray for those displaced by conflict and persecution and increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers. It was first celebrated in 1914.

According to the Migrants and Refugees Section of the Vatican's Dicastery the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, this year's theme highlights the commitment that we are all called to share in building a future that embraces God's plan, leaving no one behind. Building the future with migrants and refugees means "recognizing and promoting the role that migrants and refugees have to play in this work of construction, because only in this way will it be possible to build a world that ensures the conditions for the integral human development of all", a communiqué explains.

No one must be excluded. God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom. Indeed, the Lord says, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, a stranger and you velcomed me, naked and you clothed me, sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me" (Mt 25:34-36).

Points to Ponder this Weekend

Our readings this weekend focus on the days of reckoning, that may lie ahead for us all. The prophet Amos could clearly see what would happen to those who 'lost the run of themselves'. It is the Lord who keeps faith forever, who is just to those who are oppressed, gives bread to the hungry, sets prisoners free, gives sight to the blind.

In our second reading, St Paul reminds Timothy that a man of God should pursue what is right; piety; faith, love endurance and gentleness. The rich man in the gospel parable has not made the best use of his lifetime of opportunities for doing good. Is there a lesson there for us? Abraham suggests that reading God's word would be a good recipe to prevent his brothers from sharing his own misfortunate fate. 'Ah no, Father Abraham.' he says, 'but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead'.

Again and again, we come back to the central fact of our faith, witnessed, and affirmed by those who were closest to the events and re-enacted in this and in every Mass. When Jesus cooks a fish breakfast for them on the shore of Tiberias, 'none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?', knowing that it was the Lord... This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after being raised from the dead'.
