## **Winter Burglary Prevention**

At time of year when the clocks have gone back and darkness falls in earlier, the Gardai are once again appealing to people to secure their homes and premises and to lock up and light up during the winter months.

Traditionally burglaries increase by 20% over the winter months of October to March. Some simple methods can make your home and premises less vulnerable to criminal attack.

- Lighting around the house on a sensor or photocell.
- Lighting inside on timers
- Natural surveillance trim shrubs down to 1 metre and trees up to 2 metres.
- Use Bogus Caller Cards
- Close curtains during hours of darkness.
