Our New Bishop

Born on 25th August 1963 in Letterkenny, Co Donegal, Bishop-elect Niall Coll was ordained a priest on 3rd July 1988 for the Diocese of Raphoe, which covers most of Donegal. Over this time, he has taught at second level in Donegal, has lectured in Saint Patrick's College, Carlow and has served as Professor of Religious Studies and Religious Education, Saint Mary's University College, Belfast. In 2019 he returned to the Diocese of Raphoe and his most recent appointment has been as parish priest of Donegal and Clar.

Bishop-elect Coll's ministry has also included conducting retreats for clergy, and he has contributed to various publications, including *Doctrine and Life*, *The Furrow*, *The Irish Theological Quarterly* and *The Tablet*. In addition, he was the Editorial Director of the Catholic School ethos journal *Le Chéile*.

At Sunday's Ordination Mass, the Chief Ordaining Prelate will be Archbishop Dermot Farrell, Archbishop of Dublin, who will be assisted by Co-Consecrators Bishop Denis Nulty, Bishop of Kildare & Leighlin and outgoing Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Ossory, and by Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ, Bishop of Raphoe.

Bishops of Ossory



From 1884 to 1981 we had only three Bishops of Ossory. Bishop Brownrigg, from Wexford, was Bishop from 1884 to 1928, 44 years. He even outlived his co-adjutor, Bishop Downey, who was to succeed him but died before him.

He was succeeded by Bishop Patrick Collier, a native of Camross in the Slieve Blooms. He was bishop from 1928 until 1962.

In turn, he was succeeded by Bishop Peter Birch, a native of Conahy. Bishop Birch attended the Second Vatican Council. He died suddenly on 7th March 1981.

Bishop Laurence Forristal, a native of Thomastown parish and an auxiliary Bishop in Dublin, became our bishop to succeed Bishop Birch. Bishop Forristal served as bishop until 2007.

Upon his retirement Bishop Seamus Freeman became our bishop. A native of Callan, he was a member of the Pallottines. Due to ill health, he retired in 2016.

Bishop Dermot Farrell, from Westmeath and a priest of Meath diocese, became bishop on 11th March 2018. He was appointed Archbishop of Dublin in December 2020.

Since then, Bishop Denis Nulty, bishop of the neighbouring Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin, has been the Apostolic Administrator, appointed by Pope Francis to 'keep an eye' on us until a new bishop is ordained.

On this Sunday, 22^{nd} January Fr. Niall Coll, from the Diocese of Raphoe, a staunch Donegal man, will be ordained as our new bishop.

And it all started with Saint Kieran, from Oilean Cleire, off the Cork coast, who came to the Kingdom of Ossory and founded a Church at Seir Kieran. When you are in Kilkenny and have some time to spare, call to St. Mary's Cathedral and see the list of all the Catholic Bishops of Ossory. Bishop-elect Niall said, on the day of his appointment, 'I come to Ossory at a time of great challenge to faith, a time when Irish society is increasingly secular and individualistic. The four-century and more long dominance of the Tridentine pattern has left Catholics almost everywhere unfamiliar with and thus unskilled in discerning and negotiating possibilities for change in Church life. But trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit, discern and change we must, in line with Pope Francis' emphasis on the need for 'synodality'. I look forward to working with the priests, people and religious of the diocese of Ossory to enhance the work already underway here to develop a sustaining theological and pastoral vision, one able to invite, inform and enthuse a new generation of Christian witnesses.'
