Historic Beatification on this Sunday

This Sunday, in the Polish village of Markowa, something momentous is happening. This will be the remarkable occasion of an entire family being beatified at once, including their unborn child!

Józef Ulma and his wife Wiktoria, heavily pregnant at the time of her death, sheltered families of Jews from the Nazis. They knew what it would cost them and their family if they were ever discovered, but they couldn't turn their backs on their neighbours.

When the Nazis came for the Ulmas, it was the dead of night and everyone was sleeping. But the Nazis knew exactly what they would find: they had been tipped off. They didn't spare a single person inside the home not the Jewish families, not Józef and Wiktoria and their unborn child, not even the Ulma children: Stanisława, age 8; Barbara, 7; Władysław, 6; Franciszek, 4; Antoni, 3; and Maria, 2. After their deaths, a Bible inside their home was discovered to have the parable of the Good Samaritan underlined in red ink. They had truly lived Jesus' call to love their neighbour as themselves.

St Mary's Cathedral Tour

This weekend sees the launch of an interactive tour of St Mary's Cathedral. By means of QR codes visitors can interact with and learn about the fascinating history of this wonderful building. Built by the people of Kilkenny in the 1840s it has a rich legacy of sacred art, design and prayer. The tour will be available year-round for a daily pass at a cost of \in 5. The tour, however, will be free of charge this Sunday, 10th September and the following Sunday, 17th September. A second phase of the tour will also launch in the weeks ahead.

Synod Gathering

In advance of the first assembly of the Universal Synod, which begins on 4th October 2023, an ecumenical prayer vigil is taking place in Rome to unite us all in praise and worship. In extending this invitation Pope Francis reminded us that 'the path to Christian unity and the path of synodal conversion of the Church are linked'. In a special way, young people from across the world, are asked to take part.

On Friday, 22nd September, we will join with Pope Francis and the young people invited to Rome by holding an ecumenical Taizé prayer in The Blessed Sacrament Chapel in St. Mary's Cathedral at 7.00pm with a special invitation to young people. Then on Sunday, 24th September we will gather at the 5.30pm Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral to pray for the Universal Synod. People from all across the diocese are invited to attend.

St. Mary's Cathedral Draw 2023/2024

A new cycle of draws will begin in September and tickets are available from St. John's Parish Office or any of the priests. Draws take place on the last Wednesday of each month. Tickets cost $\in 10$ per month. To date the draw has raised almost $\in 700,000$ for refurbishing the cathedral. Please continue to support this ongoing diocesan work.

Sisters from St Elisabeth Convent, Belarus

St. Elisabeth Convent was founded in 1999 in Minsk in Belarus. Since its establishment the convent has been caring for 200 orphanage children with psychophysical deficiencies. There is a charity shelter founded on the farmstead of the convent for the homeless, drug or alcohol addicts, ex-prisoners and the less able. Over 200 residents live here today. A rehabilitation facility was established two years ago for female ex-prisoners, the homeless and intellectually challenged women.

To support and develop the above ministries, the sisters operate more than twenty workshops and art studios. These include sewing and embroidery shops, candle workshop, woodcarving, stone and blacksmith workshops and many more. Together with the sisters the residents produce beautiful articles with love and prayer in the convent's workshops. Some sisters will join us at Masses next weekend and sell some of their produce at a craft stall. Visit obitelminsk.org/or further information on the sisters. Please support them if you can.
