# **Synod 2023**

The Synod on Synodality which takes place in Rome in October is officially the 16<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Assembly of Bishops. The theme of the Synod is *For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission*. Pope Francis has said that it is not a parliament with winners and losers but rather an attempt to discern how the Church can better fulfil its mandate to preach the good news in every place and culture for the benefit of all God's people.



In a break with recent Synods Pope Francis has broken the general assembly into two sessions, one in October 2023 and the second in October 2024.

Who will be there? The members of the Synod have been designated in 3 different ways.

First, by reason of the function they hold as head of various Vatican Departments (Dicasteries) and the patriarchates of Rome, Constantinople, Alexandria, Antioch and Jerusalem.

Second, those who are elected to the Synod by the episcopal conferences or by the synods or councils of the 23 Oriental (Eastern Rite) Catholic churches. Pope Francis has decreed that five men religious and five women religious were also to attend – elected by the Unions of Superior Generals that represent men and women religious – previously only men attended.

Third, a number of members were nominated by Pope Francis – 50 in all. He has also chosen 70 members (35 men and 35 women) from a list of 140 given to him by the seven continental synods. 363 persons will have the right to vote including 54 women (lay and religious) who for the first time will have the right to vote.

Bishops Brendan Leahy of Limerick and Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ of Raphoe (Donegal) will represent the Irish Bishops and the Irish Church.

## **Points to Ponder**

Interestingly, it's often easier to forgive than it is to ask forgiveness. Sincerely asking for forgiveness requires that you honestly acknowledge your sin, which is hard to take responsibility for what we have done wrong. In today's parable, the man asking patience with his debt appears to be sincere. He 'fell down' before his master asking for mercy and patience. And the master responded with mercy by forgiving him the entire debt which was more than the servant had even requested. But was the servant truly sincere or was he just a good actor? It seems that he was a good actor because as soon as he was forgiven this huge debt, he ran into someone else who actually owed him money and instead of showing the same forgiveness he was shown, 'He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Forgiveness, if it is real, must affect everything about us. It is something that we must ask for, give, receive, and give again.

Here are a few points to consider:

- Can you honestly see your sin, experience sorrow for that sin and say 'I'm sorry' to another?
- When you are forgiven, what does that do to you? Does it have the effect of making you more merciful towards others?
- Can you in turn offer the same level of forgiveness and mercy that you hope to receive from God and others?

If you cannot answer 'Yes' to all of these questions, then this story was written for you. It was written to you to help you grow more in the gifts of mercy and forgiveness. These are hard questions to face if we want to be freed of the burdens of anger and resentment. These can weigh heavily on us and God wants us freed of them.
