Some have commented, rightly, that the actual experience of Synod was more important than the document that emerged. Because that experience cannot be "unhad", the Church can never go backwards. Questions are on the table... they have been asked... we now have to continue to journey with them.

It was heartening to read that those in attendance could not imagine a future Synod without the involvement of all - that this had to be said is shocking; but that this was said is shockingly wonderful.
