Christmas Crib Walk

The Annual Church Christmas Crib Walk will take place on St. Stephens Day beginning at the Friary Church at 11.00am. This is the 21st year of the walk which in Kilkenny traditionally took place on St. Stephen's Day. This year the Crib Walk will have a special prayer for peace. Each walker will receive a Bethlehem cross to mark this special year.

The Crib: 800 Years Celebration

This year, 2023, we celebrate 800 years since St. Francis recreated the events of the first Christmas. He did this in a cave near Greccio which is 90km south of Assisi. On Christmas Eve 1223 St. Francis had the first Nativity scene – a live one – staged for the people when they came to Mass. Two weeks before Christmas in 1223 St. Francis called on a man known only as John and asked him to help him build his crib. So it was, that on 25th December that year, in the presence of many friars who had made their way to Greccio, St. Francis, when he saw the crib with the straw, the ox and the ass, was filled with joy. According to Franciscan sources St. Francis described his desire to represent the Nativity in a way that everyone could experience and take in with a glance what happened on the first Christmas:

"I would like to represent the Baby born in Bethlehem, and somehow let people see him with their own eyes ... how he was laid down in a feeding trough and how he lay there on the straw between the ox and the ass."
