

The Baptism of the Lord

The Baptism of Jesus is a significant moment in the earthly life of Jesus. It marks the time of transition from the hidden life of Jesus at Nazareth to the very public life of preaching and teaching that ended with his death and resurrection. Prior to the baptism, John the Baptist was already at work preparing the way for Jesus. John was calling people to repentance and telling them that Jesus was coming soon. At the appointed time Jesus makes his appearance and is baptised in the Jordan river by John. As Jesus comes up out of the water the Spirit descends on him, confirming him in the mission he is about to undertake. Baptism is a significant moment in the life of every Christian person. It is the formal beginning of a life lived in the Christian faith with the promise of eternal life with God awaiting the baptised person



as the end of their days. Living the promises of baptism entails a commitment to living the love of God and neighbour as modelled for us by Jesus. The same Spirit that came upon Jesus at his baptism is also given to us at our baptism and again at Confirmation. The Spirit helps us with the gifts and graces we need to live as Jesus asks us to. A Christian life is a demanding way of life and one that needs constant renewal. As we recall the baptism of Jesus today, we remember our own baptism and renew our commitment once again to living as disciples of Jesus.

During 2023 a total of 129 candidates were baptised in our parish. On this, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we pray God's continued care and blessing for them, their parents, and families.

"By God's gift, through water and the Holy Spirit, we are reborn into everlasting life. In his goodness, may God continue to pour out his blessings on these daughters and sons of his. May he make them always, wherever they may be, faithful members of his holy people".

Baptisms in St John's take place on the First and Third Saturday of each month at 4.30pm and the Fourth Sunday at 12.30pm. All bookings can be made through the Parish Office.

Points to Ponder

Like the Magi, let us offer Jesus his gifts to us on this Feast weekend of the Epiphany.

- 1) The first gift might be friendship with God. After all, the whole point of Christmas is that God's Son became one of us to redeem us and call us friends. God wants our friendship in the form of wholehearted love and devotion.
- 2) A second gift might be friendship with others. This kind of Friendship can be costly. The price it exacts is vulnerability and openness to others. The Good News, however, is that, in offering friendship to others, we will receive back many blessings.
- 3) A third gift might be the gift of reconciliation. This gift repairs damaged relationships. It requires honest, humility, understanding, forgiveness and patience.
- 4) The fourth gift of this season is the gift of peace: seeking God's peace in our own lives through prayer, the Sacramental life and daily meditation on the Word of God. It is out of humble gratitude that we give Him from the heart our gifts of worship, prayer, singing, possessions, talents, and time. As we give our insignificant, little gifts to God, the good news is that God accepts them!

Like the Magi offering their gifts of Gold, frankincense, and myrrh, we offer what we have, from the heart, in response to what that Child has given to us – Himself.

Are You Baptised?

If you were asked the question: 'Are you baptised?' Would you answer 'Yes, I was baptised' or would you answer 'Yes, I am baptised?' Which would be more correct? The answer 'Yes, I was baptised' is correct in the sense that our baptism happened on a specific date and time. But 'Yes, I am baptised' is the more complete answer.

Using the present tense informs others and reminds ourselves that our baptism is much more than a historical event. It is and remains a defining truth of who we are and who we have become - disciples of Christ and as people whose lives have been united irreversibly to his life, death and resurrection because of our baptism. It means the Spirit of Christ has been poured into our hearts crying 'Abba Father' and therefore we have become co-heirs with Christ and beloved children of God whom we dare to call Father. In the words of Pope Francis: 'Our baptism is not a formality! It is an act that touches the depths of our existence. A baptized child and an unbaptized child are not the same. A person who is baptized and a person who is not baptized are not the same. We, by Baptism, are immersed in that inexhaustible source of life which is the death of Jesus, the greatest act of love in all of history; and thanks to this love we can live a new life, no longer at the mercy of evil, of sin and of death, but in communion with God and with our brothers and sisters.'
