# Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18<sup>th</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup> January 2024 You shall love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself (Luke 10.27)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing the Week of Prayer, Christians move toward the fulfilment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (cf. John 17:21).

The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2024 was selected by the Pontifical Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, the World Council of Churches, and the Christian Churches in Burkina Faso, coordinated by the community of *Chemin Neuf*, a French Catholic ecumenical community of vowed and lay people and its local community in Burkina Faso.

The theme, taken from the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, reflects the connection between love of God and love of neighbour with a particular concern for challenging the boundaries of who is considered "neighbour". In this verse, Jesus is questioned as to the path to eternal life. His answer is not to only observe the commandments, but to also imitate the love of God in the giving of self for another. It is a call for charity, mercy, justice, and unity. Let us keep this intention in our prayers and actions during the Week of Prayer which runs

# St Ita – Feast Day 15<sup>th</sup> January

Saint Ita, "the Foster Mother of the Irish Saints," was born in the fifth century. She, like many of the Irish saints, was born in Co. Waterford of noble and Christian parents. Early on she set her mind on serving Christ in religious life. She founded a monastery, school, and convent at Killeedy which still bears her name near Newcastle West in County Limerick. A holy well still marks the site of her church.

St. Ita once told St. Brendan that the three things most displeasing to God were a face that hates mankind, a will that clings to the love of evil, and placing one's entire trust in riches. The three things most pleasing to God were the firm belief of a pure heart in God, the simple religious life, and liberality with charity. St. Ita fell asleep in the Lord in 570AD.
