World Day of the Sick

Next Sunday, 11th February, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, is World Day of the Sick. On 13th May 1992, a number of years following an assassination attempt on his life that led to a time of suffering and the experiences of being seriously ill in hospital, Saint Pope John Paul II launched a World Day of Prayer for the Sick. Pope Benedict and Pope Francis have continued this special world day. It is a time to reflect on the needs of all who suffer, to pause and be prayerful in solidarity with those who experience illness and with all who care for those who are facing sickness.

Pope Francis' theme for World Day of the Sick 2024 is: "It is not good that man should be alone" (cf Gen 2:18). Pope Francis is very concerned for elderly people, and especially those who suffer in isolation. We are created to be together, not alone. The Pope goes on to say that "the first form of care needed in any illness is compassionate and loving closeness. To care for the sick means above all to care for their relationships: with God, - with others - family members, friends, healthcare workers - with creation and with themselves. Can this be done? Yes, it can be done if all of us are called to ensure that it happens."

We will include special prayers for the sick during our 10.30am Mass on next Saturday morning, 10th February. The sick who are able to get to the church are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Sick during this Mass. Those who cannot get to church are invited to join us at this time on webcam and radio. Frs. Dan and Raymond are happy to celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick with parishioners in their own homes at any other time. Please contact the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Points to Ponder

Even Jesus struggled to find his purpose at the beginning of his ministry, but he knew how to discover it. He prayed. The one who knew God's heart better than anyone still set aside time to be alone with his Father in the darkness, to seek God's will in extended times of prayer.

Called to service, called to community, we are also sometimes called into the darkness. It is here that we meet God, and sometimes our fears, face to face. It is in solitude and darkness that we find our purpose and learn to trust completely in God's will. Being alone in the dark wilderness was not the safest place to be in the first century. For Jesus, though, it was the only place where he could talk one-on-one with his Father, without interruption.

Well, almost without interruption. The disciples would probably have preferred for Jesus to stay in Capernaum, healing from his home base, and theirs. But Jesus leads them out into their own dark wilderness: the unknown territory of introducing others to the Kingdom of God and leading them to repentance. The disciples learned that you cannot be a true follower of Jesus by sitting in the comfort of your own living room. You have to get up, as Simon's mother-in-law did, and join with others in the work of the Kingdom of God. Because for some people, we are the only Jesus they will ever meet.
