The Ten "Signposts for Freedom"

Spend time with each commandment, asking how it sheds lights on your experience and how each one might be a source of ever greater "setting free", as you mull over these great "signposts for freedom."

St. Kieran – Feast Day 5th March

St. Kieran is known as one of the twelve Apostles of Ireland. One legend tells of St. Patrick giving Kieran a bell that rang for the first time when he reached the sight of a holy well in Saighir (Seir Kieran), and there he built his church. This became renowned as a sacred place, and many of the ancient Kings of Ossory were buried there. Seir Kieran is still a parish in our diocese. In the twelfth century the Canons Regular of St Augustine were established at Saighir Kieran. After the penal times, in 1782, Bishop John Thomas Troy of Ossory (later archbishop of Dublin) established a Catholic diocesan seminary, St Kieran's College, in Kilkenny. The motto he gave it was: *Hiems transiit*, a quotation from the Song of Songs applied to the passing of the winter of the Penal Laws in Ireland. When the Catholic cathedral was built in 1843, although it was called St Mary's, it also has Kieran as its secondary patron.
