Mass of Installation

Pope Leo XVI will be formally installed as Pontiff when he holds his first public Mass at St. Peter's Square this weekend. The papal inauguration involves the formal bestowal of the Pallium and the Ring of the Fisherman. The Mass used to include the papal coronation ceremony, but that portion of the celebration has not been included in the Mass since Pope John Paul I was officially installed as pope in 1978. His predecessor, Pope Paul VI, was the last Pope to be crowned or to use a papal tiara.

Before the Mass Pope Leo XIV and the cardinals will gather at the High Altar of St Peter's Basilica praying before the Tomb of St Peter. The Pallium and the Ring of the Fisherman will be carried from the tomb and the new Pope and concelebrating cardinals, bishops and priests will process to the Square. During the Mass the new Pope will receive the Pallium, a woollen stole which symbolises his authority as Pope. Prayers will be read aloud for the new Pope before the Ring of the Fisherman will be presented. Six cardinals, two of each order, will the profess their obedience to Pope Francis on behalf of the College of Cardinals.

Pope's Timetable this Week

Sunday, 18th May, 10.00am: Pope Leo will celebrate Mass in St. Peter's Square marking the beginning of the Pontificate.

On Tuesday, 20th May, Pope Leo will take possession of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

On Wednesday 21st May, Pope Leo will give his first General Audience in St Peter's Square. On Sunday, 25th May, the new Poe will pray the Regina Coeli at midday and will greet the pilgrims in St Peter's Square. Pope Leo XIV will take possession of the Papal Basilica of St. John Lateran and the Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major early in June. St Peter's, St Paul Outside the Walls, St John Lateran's and St Mary Major's are the four major basilicas in Rome. St Sebastian's Basilica, St Laurence and Basilica of the Holy Cross are the three minor basilicas. During a Holy Year pilgrims are invited to visit these seven basilicas. St John Lateran's is the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Rome.
