Saint Carlo Acutis

Carlo Acutis (3rd May 1991 – 12th October 2006) was a British-born Italian student celebrated for his devotion to the Eucharist and his use of digital media to promote Catholic devotion. Born in London and raised in Milan, he created a website documenting Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions. Diagnosed with leukaemia, he died at age fifteen. Beatified in 2020, he is regarded as a model for young believers and will be canonised as a saint on this Sunday, 7th September. Acutis is often referred to as the "first millennial saint".

Canonisation of Saints Pier Giorgio Fracatti and Carlo Acutis

The Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, will canonise Pier Giorgio Fracatti and Carlo Acutis in Rome on this Sunday, 7 th September. There will be a live stream presentation of the ceremony in the Chapter House, St. Mary's Cathedral from 9.00am to 12.00 noon, organised by the Lay Dominicans. Light refreshments will be available in aid of Teach Tom.

The Community School in Castlecomer has a relic of Carlo Acutis and during school holidays it is honoured in the Parish Church in Castlecomer. A special reliquary which has been commissioned to display the relic and the sacred space can be visited until the end of the month when the relic returns to the Community School. To quote Carlo: "Our aim had to be infinite and not finite... All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies". Blessed Carlo put the Sacrament of the Eucharist as the centre of his life and referred to is as "my highway to heaven".

At 11.00am on this Sunday Bishop Coll will celebrate Mass in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Castlecomer to mark the canonisation. The bishop will bless all present with the first-class relic of the new Saint Carlo Acutis which is currently reserved in the Parish Church



An Invitation to Reflect on Sunday Mass

Speaking on last Sunday in the Cathedral of the Assumption, Carlow at the launch of the Irish Catholic Bishops' Pastoral Letter "Why Sunday Matters" Bishop Denis Nulty said: -

"Today's Pastoral was born out of the experience of the Covid Pandemic. We never wish to return to those times, yet its experience was in a sense, a grace in itself. The Eucharist, the Sunday Mass was removed from its worst enemy, which as the Capuchin Cardinal Raniero Cantalamessa described as "being turned into just a routine habit, into something we take for granted, or reduced to no more than a pious practice". The Eucharistic Congress in Dublin in 2012 had the theme 'Communion with Christ and Communion with One Another'. This is what we missed most during those pandemic days. Sunday worship was disrupted, the sacramental life of the parish was put on hold. Some have not returned to worship and some had never connected. Today across the island, in every diocese, in every parish, all are encouraged to return.

Sunday Mass is our way of affirming that life has meaning. Sunday Mass is where God's story and ours meet. In opening ourselves and listening to His story, our own in a very broken and wounded world makes sense. Mass is a reenactment of the death and resurrection of Jesus, first celebrated at the Last Supper, this we participate in on the Lord's Day, that's why we call it 'Keeping Holy the Lord's Day' or 'Keeping Holy the Sabbath'. Just ask yourself what has replaced your Sunday worship? What has allowed it to slip? How might it be re-prioritised?"

To show our commitment to the Season of Creation a limited number of hard copies are available, with the hope that people might read it online or download it from the Bishops' Website. It is hoped the Pastoral will manage to stimulate rich conversation at Sunday brunch or lunch tables, or at Parish Pastoral Council or Parish Team meetings. The questions that might spark such conversation come at the end of the Pastoral. Have a look for yourself.

Traveller Suicide Prevention Campaign

"Remembrance" will be the theme of our 10.30am Mass at St. John's Church on Wednesday. To mark the National Traveller Suicide and Mental Health Awareness Campaign which runs from 10th September to 8th October 2025 St. John's Parish will host this Mass with some refreshments and a talk to follow in the Parish Hall. Members of the travelling community, supported by our Senior Choir, will take a leading role in the liturgy. Members of the congregation are invited to bring pictures or articles associated with deceased friends for blessing during the ceremony. This is a public parish event, and all are invited to come to remember our deceased relatives and friends while offering hope and support for Travellers impacted by suicide and highlighting the need to address Traveller mental health inequalities through policy and service provision.
