The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

'The cross is the school of love.' - St Maximilian Kolbe teaches that suffering, when united with Christ, transforms us, deepening our capacity for love and self-giving.

'Do not seek a cross—the right one will find you. But when it comes, take it up bravely, without counting the cost.' - St Padre Pio encourages trust in God's providence, accepting the trials He permits for our sanctification.

'The weight of the cross may press heavily on your shoulders, but it is the very thing that will keep you close to the heart of Christ.' - An anonymous reflection highlighting that struggles, rather than driving us away from God, draw us nearer to Him.

'The cross is the ladder to heaven.' - St Rose of Viterbo's words reveal that trials, rather than obstacles, are stepping stones to holiness. When we embrace our crosses instead of resenting them, we participate in Christ's redemptive work and ascend toward eternal joy.

Each of these quotes emphasizes that carrying our cross is not meaningless suffering but a path to spiritual growth, love, and union with Christ. Whether through Scripture or the wisdom of saints, we learn that our trials, borne with faith, become means of grace and transformation. (Deepseek.com)

Relic of St Carlo Acutis

The relic of St Carlo Acutis which has been in the Parish Church in Castlecomer over the past few weeks will now be transferred to the Oratory in Castlecomer Community School; it will be joyfully welcomed back to the Parish Church during school holidays.

It was interesting to note that Pope Leo referred to Family Parish and School as the place where St Carlo's faith was nourished and fostered. "Carlo, for his part, encountered Jesus in his family... and then at school, and above all in the sacraments celebrated in the parish community. He grew up naturally integrating prayer, sport, study and charity into his days as a child and young man".

He quoted St Carlo: "In front of the sun, you get a tan. In front of the Eucharist, you become a sain!" And again: "Sadness is looking at yourself; happiness is looking at God. Conversion is nothing more than shifting your gaze from below to above; a simple movement of the eyes is enough."

Referring also to Pier Giorgio Frassati, who was declared a saint with Carlo, Pope Leo XIV said that both young saints are an invitation to all of us, especially young people, not to squander our lives, but to direct them upwards and make them masterpieces.
