## The Rosary: A Prayer of Peace and Presence

October, the Month of the Most Holy Rosary, invites us to rediscover one of the Church's most beloved devotions. The Rosarv is more than a string of beads – it is a spiritual lifeline, a rhythm of prayer that draws us into the life of Christ through the eyes of His Blessed Mother. Each decade leads us through the mysteries of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, allowing us to meditate on the Gospel with Mary as our guide. In its simplicity, the Rosary offers profound depth: it is a prayer of contemplation, intercession, and hope. Whether prayed alone or in community, it brings peace to hearts and homes and has been called a "spiritual weapon" against the turmoil of the world. This October, let us renew our devotion to the Rosary. Consider setting aside time each day to pray the Rosary - perhaps for peace in our families, healing in our parish, or unity in the Church. As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, "To recite the Rosary is nothing other than to contemplate with Mary the face of Christ

#### **Studying for the Priesthood**

Thirteen new seminarians have begun their 2025-2026 academic programme and priestly formation for Irish dioceses. Welcoming the new student intake, Bishop Alphonsus Cullinan said, "It is really heartening that thirteen men have started as seminarians in various locations to study on propaedeutic courses. This brings the number of men training for the priesthood for Irish dioceses to 77 in total. We thank God for each of them. In recent years, there has been a small but steady number of men beginning their studies for priesthood for Irish dioceses. While this is encouraging, in no way should this trend make us complacent. We need more priests, and we must continue to do what we can to promote priestly vocations in families and in our parishes. Firstly, we must believe in the utter need for priests to continue the sanctifying work of Jesus Christ. Without the priest there is no Eucharist, and without the Eucharist there is no Church. We need to pray, but not only to offer a few quick prayers of the faithful, rather to beg the Lord of the Harvest to send us more priests."

#### From Africa to Ossory

Early this week we will say a sad farewell to Fr. Joseph Lubula who has ministered in our parish for the past ten weeks. On Tuesday Fr. Joseph returns to Uganda to continue his work as Managing Director of *Radio Sapientia*, the Catholic Radio of Uganda which, among other things, advocates for peace, justice, political maturity, human rights and duties, with special consideration for children, youth, women and the family. We gained much from Fr. Joseph's presence among us this Summer and we hope he picked up a few lessons from us. The parish community sincerely thanks him for his time with us and wishes him well as he returns to his ministry with the Ugandan Bishops' Conference in his native country. *Slán go fóill*.

As we say goodbye to Fr. Joseph this week, we welcome to our diocese two priests from the Diocese of Damongo in Ghana. Frs. Felix Bonkaanaie and Paul Kasu are coming to minister on long term contracts with the Diocese of Ossory. Bishop Niall has asked us to welcome Fr. Felix to the St. John's Parish Team. Fr. Paul will work in St. Patrick's Parish. While we have learned much from Fr. Joseph temporary presence among us the reality with Fr. Felix will be new and very different. From the beginning Fr. Felix will take on a full role as a priest team member in our parish and in the City Pastoral Area. He will be involved in all aspects of parish life, and we can expect to find him officiating at Masses, baptisms, weddings, sick calls, anointings and funerals. Our two new colleagues will have much to learn about the Church in Ossory, and over the next two weeks they will get some formal assistance in orientating themselves before taking up full ministry in our diocese. We welcome Fr. Felix among us in St. John's Parish and look forward to his ministry in the Diocese of Ossory.
